### **Church & State**

"Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's." - Matthew 22:21

At the end of every sermon, there are "extras." These are notes & reflections that (for various reasons) are edited out of the final draft of the sermon. As some of you know, I try to jam them into the 11 AM Sunday sermon. Most of the time, I forget about these pieces left on the cutting board. Here's a reflection that didn't make it into a sermon, but offers

important guidance for Christians as we consider the relationship between church and state.

"Abraham Lincoln had it right. Our task should not be to invoke religion and the name of God by claiming God's blessing and endorsement for all our national policies and practices - say, in effect, that God is on our side. Rather, Lincoln said, we should pray and worry earnestly whether we are on God's side.

Those are the two ways that religion has been brought into public life in American history. The first way - God on our side - leads inevitably to triumphalism, self-righteousness, bad theology, and, often, dangerous foreign policy. The second way - asking if we are on God's side - leads to much healthier things, namely, penitence and even repentance, humility, reflection, and even accountability. We need much more of all these, because these are often the missing values of politics." - Jim Wallis, "God's Politics: Why the Right Gets it Wrong and the Left Doesn't Get It"

Friends, our nation is becoming more and more estranged along political lines. As Christians, I encourage us to spend less time watching cable news and more time in prayer. Let's seek to love God more. Let's seek to love our neighbors more – even when we disagree. Let's "pray and worry earnestly whether we are on God's side."

### **Safety Policy & Holy Communion**

"One bread, one body, one Lord of all,
One cup of blessing which we bless.
And we, though many, throughout the earth,
We are one body in this one Lord."

Let me express my gratitude to our Church Safety Team and Church Council for their ongoing diligence and leadership, especially during this pandemic. As of June 14, our Church Safety Policy allows fully vaccinated persons to attend worship services and meetings at Faith with or without a mask. It reiterates our position that unvaccinated persons (ages 2+) should wear masks in the building. It allows for singing during services and removed the 6 foot social distancing rules. Check out our website (www.faithumcop.org) to read the full list of guidelines.

Let me encourage us to remain diligent in our care for one another. This pandemic is not over, and there are many vulnerable sisters & brothers among us. So, whenever we gather, let's make it a priority to care for one

another's health and well-being. If you are not fully vaccinated, please wear a mask inside the church. When you arrive at church for worship or any event/meeting, please register so we can keep accurate contact tracing lists. Please maximize fist bumps (or elbow bops) and minimize hugging and hand shakes. In these simple ways, we can all do our part in ending this pandemic.

I have spoken with a number of you who are still unwilling (or unable) to worship in-person. With this in mind, we will do something different with Holy Communion starting this month. At the beginning of worship services where we will celebrate Holy Communion (ie. 1<sup>st</sup> weekend of each month,) we will remind online worshippers to prepare bread and juice at home.

Some of you have asked when we will resume the "old way" of receiving communion. For safety reasons, we will likely continue our method of sharing communion via pre-packaged elements in our pews through the fall. As always, thank you for your flexibility and patience.




### Sale! Sale! Sale!




### Scrip


