Advent & Christmas

"Waiting is the hardest work of hope." - Lewis Smedes

Advent is the season of waiting. The word "advent" derives from the Latin "adventus," which means "coming." Advent the season of preparation for the celebration of Jesus' birth. It's also the season of anticipation for Jesus' second coming – when Christ will come to judge the living and the dead.



One of the ways we prepare is communal worship. This Advent, we'll reflect on traditional Advent scriptures and themes. Each weekend, we'll light candles on the Advent wreath – a wreath holding 4 outer candles and 1 inner candle. The four exterior candles represent Advent themes of joy, hope, peace, and love. As we light candles, we'll remember our longing for these virtues in our personal life and wider world. When we light the central candle – the Christ candle – we'll celebrate God's response to our longings – by sending us Jesus.

2 Joint Services, Christmas Eve, & New Year's Day

Traditionally, Faith concludes our year by offering one joint service on the final weekend of the year. This gives a much-needed break for our AV & worship volunteers, who lead 3 worship services every weekend for the rest of the year. The joint service also encourages our congregation to gather together at one service instead of three different times.

Due to the timing of Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve this year, we will close 2021 and begin 2022 with **two Joint Worship services**. On **Sunday, December 26 AND Sunday, January 2**, we will gather for a single worship service on Sunday morning at **10:00 AM**. Please note these special worship times on your calendar.

Praise God that we can gather for in-person **Christmas Eve services** in 2021.

On **Friday, December 24**, we will offer worship services at **4:00 PM, 7:00 PM, and 11:00 PM**.

The **4:00 PM** service is an interactive and shorter service designed with children in mind.

The **7:00 & 11:00 PM** services are more traditional in design and feature a full-length sermon and music by the Faith Rising Band (7 PM) and Chancel Choir (11 PM). All 3 services will include carols, communion, and candles.

Every year, I lead a New Year's Day service on January 1. This is an opportunity for us to kick off the new year with worship. The format is simple. There are no additional music nor AV staff present. I will lead this New Year's Day service on **Saturday, January 1 @ 10:00 AM**.

So, here's the worship service schedule for December. Note: we are offering our regular worship schedule (*Sat @ 4 PM, Sun @ 9 & 11 AM*) unless otherwise noted. After the two joint services, we will resume our regular worship schedule on January 8&9, 2022.





Blue Christmas

Remember Elvis's "Blue Christmas"? Is this Christmas time a blue time for you? Do you feel more like singing the blues than joining in the chorus of "Joy to the World"?



Of course, for many of us Christmas is truly the best time of the year and the joy in our hearts is palpable. But for the person struggling with grievous loss and disappointment, joy can be quite elusive.

For some of us Christmas can magnify feelings of grief, anxiety, loneliness, even depression. And as others around us are celebrating a merry Christmas, such joyous merriment, can make us feel, even bluer.

Mindful of our friends doing their best to cope with the blues, we will be hosting a Blue Christmas Service in the sanctuary at 2:00pm on Sunday, December 12. The service is for anyone feeling blue. The worship that afternoon will be uniquely designed for those of us whose hearts and souls are aching.

In reviewing the liturgy of the service, I can tell you that the movement of the worship is both powerful and healing. We will light 4 candles: 1) to remember those persons who have been loved and lost 2) to remember the pain of loss – loss relationships, the loss of a job, the loss of health 3) to remember ourselves – past memories of loss and the pain of reflecting on our own mortality 4) to remember our faith and the gift of hope that accompanies the Christmas story.

The Blue Christmas Service promises to touch the hearts of all who come to worship. In many ways I believe that it is a service meant for all of us.

So please, come alongside one another in worship on the afternoon of the 12th. It is my prayer that we might all be filled with hope and the healing power of heaven above, as we lay our blues before Emmanuel - God with us!
