### New Beginnings

*"God has made everything beautiful in its time." - Ecclesiastes 3:11*

I love these words in Ecclesiastes. They remind us that each day is new and different. While the past is beautiful, so is the future. While we celebrate all that God has done yesterday, we look forward to tomorrow with expectation and hope.

Starting July 1, Faith is entering into a new season. We're pivoting from having two full-time clergy to having additional specialized part-time staff. Instead of having our associate pastor oversee youth ministry, congregational care, AND lead worship services, we have multiple staff people and a new ministry team (Lay Worship Leaders) to oversee these ministry areas.

**Kim Clifton** joined Faith's staff in 2014 as the Director of Children's Ministry. Under her leadership, our ministry with children has grown. We offer an excellent Sunday School program. We have an exciting Vacation Bible School. We provide engaging children's programs and activities (fun and mission-oriented) throughout the year. Starting this month, Miss Kim will serve as our **Director of Family Ministries** – overseeing both children and youth ministries. I am excited to serve with Miss Kim in this expanded role. I ask for your prayers and support as she leads our ministry to our youngest members and families.

**Rev. Joshua Bailey-Green** is an ordained elder in The United Methodist Church. He joins our staff as the **Director of Audio -Visual and Web Ministries**. Pastor Josh is a gifted preacher and thoughtful church leader. He is also a gifted "computer guy" with a heart for reaching the unchurched through web ministries. He joins our ministry (as part-time staff, full-time husband, and father of two children) as he pursues ongoing theological training at The University of Chicago. Let's pray for Pastor Josh and his family as they adjust to life in Orland Park.

Note: we are still working to fill the 3<sup>rd</sup> staff position, **Director of Congregational Care**.

### July Sermon Schedule

At the end of May, we started our summer series through **The Gospel of Matthew**. Over the past month, we worked our way through Matthew's 28 chapters – which includes the Sermon on the Mount, Beatitudes, and Great Commission. I encourage you to read 4 chapters of Matthew each week during this journey.

In mid-July, we'll start a new sermon series covering the surprising heroes & heroines in the Bible. These are flawed people with questionable characters and skeletons bursting out of their closets. They are highly unlikely candidates for anything, let alone vital missions that impact the lives of entire cities and nations, and yet, God saw their potential and promise. While no one else believed in them, God believed in them and chose them - just as God chooses you and me – for God's holy purposes. I hope you'll join us for this epic summer series, **"Unlikely Heroes."**

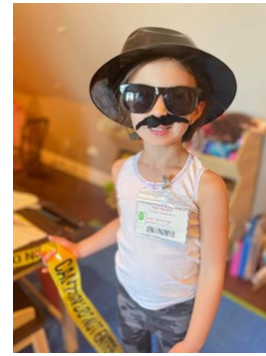
Thank you for your faith in me, your support of the family ministry programs and your love of all of our Faith Kids!

## Updated Reopening Guidelines June 14, 2021



Changes when IL reaches Phase 5 (50% of residents 16 and older have been vaccinated and stable or declining COVID-19 metrics are recorded during a 28-day monitoring period)

- Fully vaccinated persons are welcome to attend services and meetings at FUMC with or without a mask. We will continue to strongly expect that non-vaccinated persons age 2 and above wear masks in the church.
- Removal of 6 foot social distancing requirements – entire building
- Registration, either through preregistration or registration upon entering the building, will continue for church services and/or church gatherings
- Allow shared food (resume Taste of Faith (Sept.) and funeral luncheons
- Reopen drinking fountains
- Resume live music at the discretion of the directors
- Allow congregational singing
- Restore Bibles, hymnals, pencils, prayer cards etc. to pews
- Provide bulletins for services
- Resume normal cleaning/sanitizing of building

Misc.

- Sunday School – Resume at the earliest in the fall of 2021 (Sept. 18-19). Teachers and students must wear masks. (Revisit the reopening in August.)
- Nursery- Resume when fully staffed. Attendants must wear masks. Children over the age of 2 must wear masks. Attendants must demonstrate proof of being fully vaccinated. No snacks will be served. (Revisit the reopening in August.)

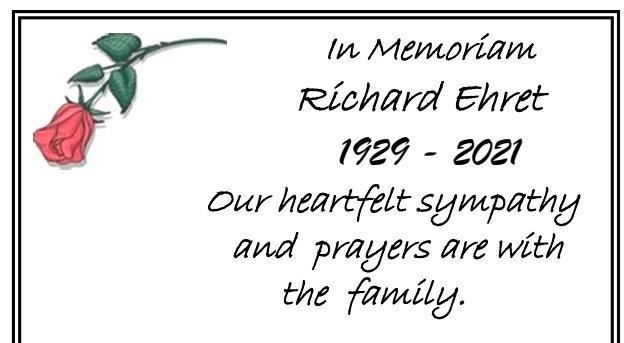



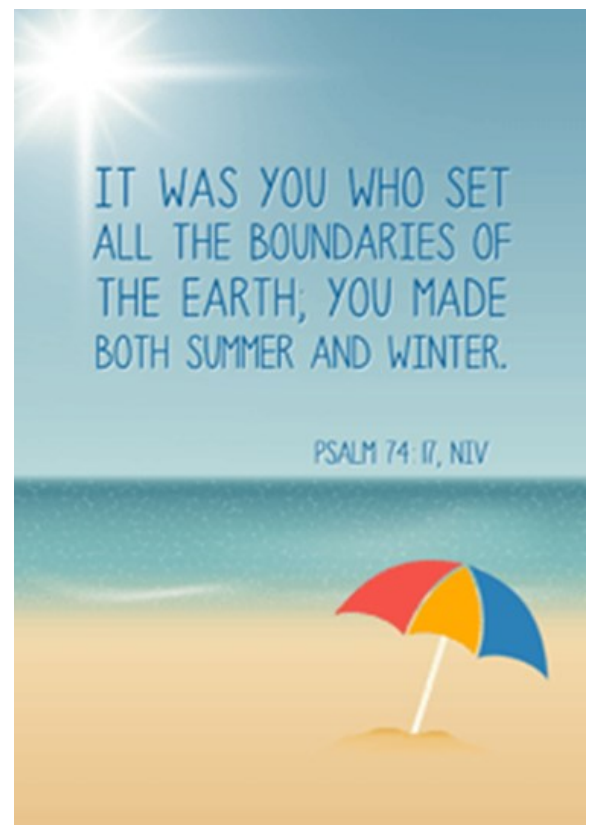
