Lent

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me" - Psalm 51:10

Lent is the season of 40 days before Easter. It's a season of self-examination, repentance, and renewal. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (February 17, 2021).

This is a day when Christians receive the mark of the cross made of ashes. Ashes remind us of our mortality. *"From dust we came and to dust we shall return."*

A traditional view of Lent emphasizes the need for death precedes resurrection. Just as Christ suffered and laid down his life for our sake, we are invited to share in his suffering by taking honest inventory of our lives and putting an end to those sins that lead us astray from God. This may be unhealthy habits, patterns, or addictions. This may be unforgiveness, bitterness, or pride. For some, Lent is a season to abstain from certain pleasures like chocolate, soft drinks, red meat or ESPN.

Lent is a season for spiritual spring cleaning. During this season, we renew our commitment to Christian discipleship through spiritual disciplines. Part of this reconnection may be daily devotions – designating 15 minutes every day for prayer and scripture study. Part of this reconnection may be engaging in spiritual practices such as joining a small group or tithing. Perhaps you'll reengage distant and/or damaged relationships with siblings. Perhaps you'll find ways to serve the hungry, care for the sick, and speak up for the voiceless. Perhaps you'll renew your commitment to healthy eating, exercising, and living. Whatever you do, do it sincerely, prayerfully and humbly.

Lenten Study & Small Groups

During Lent, our congregation is invited to engage in spring Small Groups. We'll engage in a six-session video-based study, **"When the Game is Over, It All Goes Back in the Box."** All Lenten Small Groups will initially meet virtually starting the week of February 21. Some Small Groups may meet in-person when Covid rates improve. Participants are asked to purchase participant guides on your own. The accompanying book is optional. If you've never joined a Small Group, I encourage you to try it. Small Groups offer opportunities for Prayer, Study, Sharing, and Service. Each small group session will line up with the weekend's sermon and video-teaching. However, our Church Council has been clear that we need to proceed safely and responsibly. So, let's be patient. As we wait, let's continue to love and pray and care for one another. We'll get through this together.

February Sermon Series

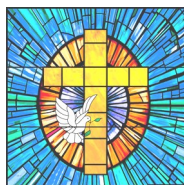
Food for Faith Families

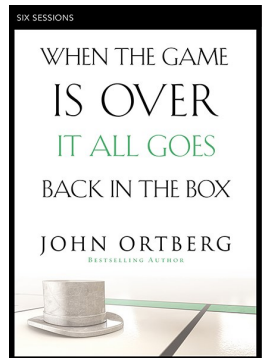


Small Groups COMING SOON - SMALL GROUP STUDY

Veteran Voices

Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, members of Veterans Voices Military Group have been reaching out and providing assistance to veterans in an ever-expanding area. Two area veterans were provided transportation assistance. Two residents of the Illinois State Veterans Home at Manteno were provided clothing for their special needs. Veterans Voices also donated the equipment to help keep the veterans home residents involved, engaged and amused by applying their target shooting skills to hitting a balloon (mounted on a remote-control car) using a Nerf gun.



Veterans Voices supported the local community by participating in the various ceremonies and activities conducted by the village of Orland Park. This included Memorial Day, the Taste of Orland Celebration-Salute to Veterans, the 2020 Orland Park Veterans Golf Classic, and Veterans Day.

In October Veterans Voices delivered name brand sodas and chip snack packs for the residents of the Manteno Veterans Home, and yet another project delivered books, DVDs and CDs from the Orland Park Public Library to the in-house library at Manteno.

Finally, for Christmas each resident at Manteno was sent a Christmas card. Several residents received new shoes. Two residents received devices to assist them in hearing their televisions and radios. Also, children at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, whose parents were deployed to Eastern Europe, enjoyed a Christmas program, funded in part by a donation from Veterans Voices.

Thanks to all the members, members spouses, and community members who have supported these efforts throughout a difficult 2020.

Blood Drive

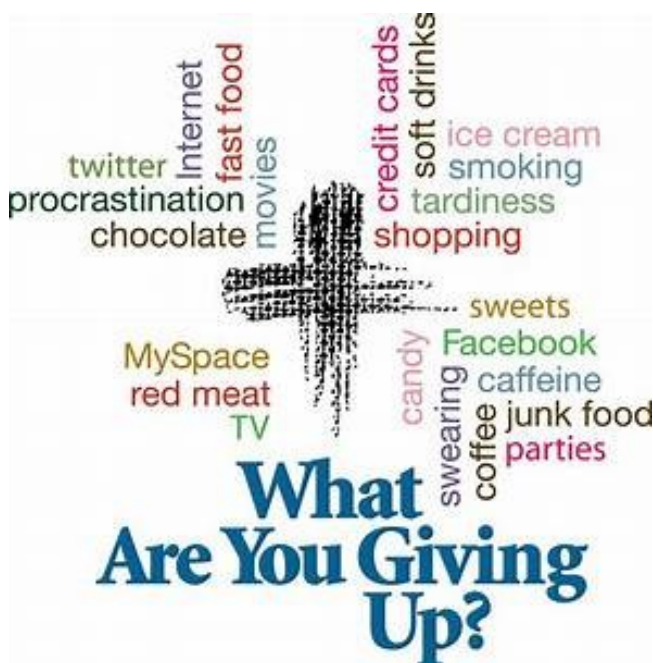
We had 10 donations at our last blood drive on Sunday, 1/10. Thank you to all who donated. Those donations could save 30 lives!
