March was an unexpected month. I didn't expect a 2 week quarantine. I never imagined worship services being suspended. I would have never dreamed of people hoarding toilet paper and everyone (around the globe) practicing social distancing. And yet, in the midst of these unexpected events, there were blessings. I was able to slow down and be more attentive to my children. I was able to complete odd jobs for my wife, who was texting me honey-do lists during her self-isolation.

While the world has changed dramatically, I remind us that the gospel of Jesus Christ has not changed. God's love for the world has not changed. Jesus' invitation to follow Him has not changed. The Holy Spirit's whisper to love our neighbors, even the cranky ones, has not changed. So, how will you respond? While the world has changed and most of us are in isolation, how can we love God and love our neighbor during these strange and peculiar days?

As I write this newsletter article, a verse running through my head is **Romans 12:10**. The apostle Paul writes, "love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor." In the first phrase, Paul reiterates the second half of the great commandment to LOVE one another. SERVE one another. LOOK OUT for one another. In the second of this verse, he makes this commandment FUN. He invites us to OUTDO one another in showing honor.

Some of you know that I love sports. I love "the thrill of victory and the agony of defeat." I love how sports brings out the best in us, gets our blood flowing, and pushes us to our limits. So, what does it look like to OUTDO one another in showing honor? Personally, it means being still and praying more than usual. It's going through the church directory and praying for each of you by name. It's being more responsive to the "taps" of the Holy Spirit urging me to be extra-patient when grocery shopping. It's being grateful for each day and counting God's blessings even in times like this.

While we do not know when life will return to "normal," we know that restaurants WILL reopen. School WILL reopen. Churches WILL reopen. Until then, let's be safe and follow the guidelines of government and health officials. Let's be prayerful and grateful for each and every day. And let's "outdo" one another in showing honor.

Mission

"What can I do to help during this time?" This is a question I've heard from so many of you. Thank you for offering your help. Let me encourage you to look for opportunities throughout the community. At Faith, here are a few possibilities:

Grocery Gophers – The Men of Faith are organizing to serve as gophers for church members in need. This is a service to deliver groceries or medicine or other items from the store. If you would like to join the "gopher" team OR would like to utilize this service, contact our Gopher Coordinator, Dale Carver (aonemanshow@comcast.net, 762-218-7657), and he'll put you in touch with one of our volunteers. Details will be worked out on a call-by-call basis.

Micro-Pantry – The Mission Committee has established a micro-food pantry (ie. a large bin outside our main entrance) so that no one goes hungry. Non-perishable food items can be dropped off anytime by anyone. Food items can be picked up anytime by anyone. So, the next time you go shopping, please pick up an extra can of soup or spaghetti sauce, and help us keep this micro-pantry stocked. (Note: if you drop off food donations and the bin is full, please leave your donation behind the bin.)

Pastoral Emergency Fund – Some of you know that Faith has a designated fund that provides bill assistance and gift cards for folks, who need a hand. Foreseeing the economic repercussions of this pandemic, we are anticipating an increase in assistance requests. Objective: Provide monetary assistance to our neighbors in need.



On Friday, March 13 we held our second Artivities event of the year. We learned that a plastic bottle can float around in the ocean for over 1000 years, 1000 years!!! Scripture PLE NATURE

Conduct a simple experiment to illustrate Easter's meaning.



- White carnations
- Scissors
- Vase
- Water
- Red food coloring
- Bible

What you do:

- 1. Cut the carnation stems (at an angle) to about 8 inches long.
- 2. Fill the vase halfway with water. Add 10 drops of food coloring. (More may be needed to darken the water.)
- 3. Add the cut flowers and observe what happens to the petals over time.
- 4. Discuss how this is like Jesus' work on the cross.
 Read 1 Peter 2:22-24 (NIV) and reflect on what his death means for us.
- 5. To learn more about this experiment, research capillary action.
