

myself. I justify being late with my newsletter article. I justify eating food slowly. I justify being wordy on Sunday mornings. I justify justifying myself to friends, family, strangers, and even God. So, I can relate to a smarty-pants "expert in the law," who tries to justify himself

to Jesus.

Luke tells us the conversation began with this "expert" testing Jesus, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" He wants to outsmart Jesus – to make himself look good at Jesus' expense. However, Jesus sees right through his question. Like a master teacher, Jesus responds to the question with a question. In the end, Jesus tells the expert in the law, "You're right. DO this and you will live."

Do you remember what we need to DO? Both Jesus and the expert agree that the key is LOVE – to love God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself. "And who is my neighbor?" asks the expert. Does God really expect us to love everyone always?! Does this include the co-worker who drives everyone else crazy?! Does this include the family member that everyone prays will not show up to family events?! Does God really expect us to love – when we're having a really bad day?!

In September, we're launching our Fall Small Groups. The curriculum is entitled "Everybody Always: Becoming Love in a World Full of Setbacks and Difficult People" by Bob Goff. During this 5-week sermon series and Bible study, we'll wrestle with Jesus' invitation to love everyone the way he loved them – to love everyone always – without fear, exceptions, limitations. I hope you'll make it a point to worship with us and join a small group during this series. (To learn more about Fall Small Groups, see page 7.) This series begins the weekend of September 19-20.

Also in September, we are celebrating our **Kick Off Weekend** (September 12-13). This year's theme: "The Great Adventure." While we're not kicking off our usual fall-spring ministries (e.g. Sunday School, Chancel Choir, Youth Group,) we will commemorate the start of the new school year with the Blessing of Backpacks and lift up prayers for our teachers, students, and families. In the past several months, our AV team has worked tirelessly to learn new programs, rewire existing hardware, introduce new hardware and maintain their sanity as they do their best to livestream our Sunday @ 9 AM worship services. So, while we apologize for the sound issues, as well as troubles livestreaming through YouTube, please know our Team is continuously learning and striving to do their very best. To everyone on our Audio-Visual Team – THANK YOU! We are grateful for your time, sweat, and perseverance.

Our greeters / ushers / security teams are becoming more comfortable taking temperatures and checking folks in. Pastor Caleb's message continued:

As for numbers, we average 30 people in each of our 3 services with a handful of new faces each week. That being said, this means that 2/3 of our church family is worshipping at home. Please know – this is ok. We support your decision – whether to worship online or in-person. This is why we will continue to connect each other in a variety of ways. We'll continue to offer our Midweek Devotions on Facebook (Tues/Thurs/Sat @ 2 PM) and call each other to Daily Prayer at 2 PM. We'll continue to offer our Virtual Taste of Faith @ 12:30 PM on Sunday afternoons and host Committee meetings via ZOOM. This is also why we're investing so much our time, energy, and resources into developing our Livestream Ministry. (Note: Thank you to our Endowment Committee for their \$10k grant allowing us to purchase new cameras and livestreaming equipment.)

Missional Opportunities

Recently, I was at church when some of our members stopped by our main doors. They came to utilize our Micro-Food Pantry (there was fresh produce on this weekend) and explained that they were picking up food for neighbors, who were struggling with finances. They were glad we had an ongoing Micro Food Pantry that offered food quickly and anonymously during these challenging economic times.

I invited them to share with their neighbors that our church also has a Pastoral Emergency Fund that they could utilize for emergency gas and grocery gift cards. We also offer utility and mortgage assistance. Now, the amount and frequency of assistance is limited. However, this fund is available to anyone in need. If you could use some assistance and/or have questions, please contact Pastor Caitlyn (pastorcaitlyn@faithumcop.org) or myself (pastorcaleb@faithumcop.org).

In the month of August, our Mission Committee received special offerings to pay for **Hope Packs** to bless children and families at Springfield School in Midlothian. Each Hope Pack costs \$24 and our goal was to raise \$2400 so we could pay for 100 Hope Packs. Thank you for your support!

One more missional opportunity to be aware of – our Children's Ministry invites us to **Adopt a Shoebox** for **Operation Christmas Child**. Instead of coming to a packing party at church, we're invited to take home a shoebox, fill it with treasures, and return it to church along with \$9 shipping cost. (To learn more, see page 4.)

Friends, our context has changed dramatically. However, God's invitation to LOVE remains unchanged. God still calls us to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. God still calls us to love our neighbor (even Packer fans) as ourselves. God still calls us to trust and follow Jesus. So, let's do more than just agree with Jesus. Let's LOVE – as best as we can – as all the ways we can – every day.






Children's Ministry





Food for Faith Families


Food for Faith Families is looking for more members. We provide meals for families in our congregation that need short term help after having surgery or bringing home a new baby. There are many great reasons to join us.
