




















Youth Group

Since we cannot sell the books at church this year, Golden Opportunities will offer 3 ways for Faith members to purchase books and have the credit for the sale go to Faith UMC:

You can **call 800-884-6533** and use a credit card to purchase one or more books by phone. There will be a \$5 flat shipping charge, no matter how many books are purchased as long as they're being shipped to the same address.

Members can mail in a check payable to Golden Opportunities. Again, the cost is \$25 per book ordered plus the flat \$5 shipping charge. The address is Golden Opportunities at P.O. Box 1011 Frankfort, IL 60423.

To avoid any shipping charge, you can **stop by their office at 11535 183rd Place, Unit 118 Orland Park, IL** (Take Wolf Road to 183rd Place. Turn right. Go through the first stop sign and then turn left at the first driveway. Go to Unit 118). They accept cash check, or charge. Theresa will even bring the book to your car if you don't want to go in. Please call before stopping to be sure she knows you're coming. She is typically in the office M-F from 10 a.m.-4:30 p.m.


We are still collecting non-perishable items for the Micro Pantry outside the front doors. Take what you need. Share what you can.
